

## **LeBoeuf Township Supervisors Meeting – May 26, 2021**

The LeBoeuf Township Supervisors meeting was held May 26, 2021. The meeting was called to order at 6:00 p.m. Present were James Glover, Michael Porter, Michael Whitman, Mark Corey, Chris Sennett, Jim Warner, Larry Hanas II, Rylee Barnes, Delores Dowler, Tim Pietrasewicz, Drew Francisco and Catherine Wise.

James Glover motioned to approve the minutes from the May 12, 2021, Regular Meeting. Michael Whitman seconded. All voted yes.

James Glover moved to submit for audit the Treasurer's Reports for May 20, 2021– General Fund: \$98,779.54 and State Fund: \$104,737.57. Health Reimbursement Fund: \$6,704.13. Line of Credit: Spent: \$19,000.00, Remaining: \$81,000.00. Michael Whitman seconded. Motion carried.

Solicitor Chris Sennett spoke with the LeBoeuf Township Supervisors and Representatives from the LeBoeuf Township Planning Commission concerning changes to the Proposed Amendments to the current Zoning Ordinance. He agreed to replace items removed from the original proposed amendments and add a reasonable contingency fee for LeBoeuf Township. The Amendments will be forwarded to Erie County Planning and the LeBoeuf Township Planners for a 30-day review. A public hearing will be held in July 2021, before the amendments can be voted on. Chris Sennett left at 6:25 p.m.

Engineer Mark Corey presented the received bids for the Mystic Road Bridge Project and the McGahen Hill Road Bridge Project. Eight Bids were received for the Mystic Road Bridge Replacement Project. Michael Whitman motioned to accept the low bid from Northrock Construction, for a total cost of \$137,230.00, Michael Porter seconded. All voted yes.

Six bids were received for the McGahen Hill Road Culvert Replacement Project. Michael Whitman motioned to accept the low bid from McLallen Construction for a cost of \$289,397.00. Michael Porter seconded. All voted yes. Discussion ensued on when the bridges may be completed and the length of time for the road closures. The McGahen Hill Bridge may take 3-4 weeks to complete and the Mystic Road project should be accomplished within a week or two. Both projects are slated to begin in August or September of 2021.

Girl Scout Rylee Barnes, who is working on her Silver Award, asked questions concerning the map on the wall of the meeting room. Mill Village Borough would like a similar map of their municipality in their meeting room. The Supervisors stated that they use the map at almost every meeting, and they asked her if she would consider up-dating their map to include improved roads in a different color.

The LeBoeuf Township Supervisors agreed to give the Mill Village Volunteer Fire Company a donation of \$250.00, for their help on Clean-up Day.

The LeBoeuf Township Municipal Building has a gas leak. National Fuel shut the gas off to the building. Drew Francisco will call Ed Musgrave to see if he is available to fix the pipe leak.

Michael Whitman motioned to approve and sign the Dinsmore Subdivision, James Glover seconded. All voted yes.

Mark Corey suggested that the Supervisors attend the PSATS Forum on July 20, 2021, at the Bayfront Sheraton.

Road Foreman Report: Drew Francisco reported that the road crew has been grading and brining roads. The new grader purchased from Cussawago Township has been received. The pipes have arrived for the tiling project on Old Meadville and Stone Quarry Road projects. The mowing has begun on roads. Discussion was held on sending a letter to the landowner on Mystic Road who has a fence, trailer and junk cars, these will need removed before the Mystic Road Bridge Project can be started. Discussion was held on a demonstration of a power screener for 2RC and acquiring millings from the City of Erie and PennDOT.

Zoning Officer Tim Pietrasewicz reported that clean-up day went very well. The TV's still need to be taken to Liberty Iron for Electronic Recycling. Drew Francisco will check with Raccoon Refuse – They may accept electronics also. It was suggested, to contact the local high school next year to ask students to volunteer for Clean-Up Day, in order to earn Community Service hours.

Correspondence and one Logging Permit were read and reviewed.

Michael Whitman motioned to ratify Bills & Payroll for May 20, 2021. James Glover seconded. All voted yes.

Michael Porter moved, seconded by Michael Whitman, to adjourn the regular meeting at 7:45 p.m. Motion carried unanimously.
