

LeBoeuf Township Supervisors Meeting – April 14, 2021

The LeBoeuf Township Supervisors meeting was held April 14, 2021. The meeting was called to order at 8:00 a.m. Present were James Glover, Michael Porter, Michael Whitman, Dale Tshudy, Mike Klink, Dolores Mayhue, Marjore Wiater, Don Faub, Marlay Shollenberger, Tim Pietrasewicz, Drew Francisco and Catherine Wise.

Michael Whitman motioned to approve the minutes from the March 24, 2021 Regular Meeting with the addition of Michael Whitman's name to the roster. James Glover seconded. All voted yes. James Glover moved to submit for audit the Treasurer's Reports for April 8, 2021– General Fund: \$29,011.25 and State Fund: \$127,527.04. Health Reimbursement Fund: \$6,704.13. Line of Credit: Spent: \$20,000.00, Remaining: \$80,000.00. Michael Whitman seconded. Motion carried.

In regards to the funds from the American Rescue Plan –Supervisors have checked into allowable uses for the funds. Road Improvements are not an allowable expense, reimbursement for lost funds is, along with stormwater management, which are being considered at this time. Other uses for the funds will be discussed at a later date.

Dale Tshudy was present to discuss Frisbeetown Road and to ask what the status is on Short-Term and Long-Term improvements and maintenance. He would like the road graded and brined and asked about the Tarring and Chipping of roadways. Supervisors informed him that they would not be Tarring and Chipping the road within the next 2 years. Mr. Tshudy left at 8:20 a.m.

Michael Porter motioned to sign the 960 Kinter Hill Road Subdivision; Michael Whitman seconded. All voted yes. Mr. Faub, Mrs. Mayhue and Ms. Wiater left at 8:35 to deliver the plans to Erie County Planning.

Michael Porter motioned to sign the Sewage Facilities Planning Module for the Regis and Linda Fitzgibbon SFTF on Gourley Road. Michael Whitman seconded. All voted yes. Michael Whitman motioned to adopt and sign Resolution #3 of 2021 – Plan Revision for New Land Development for Regis & Linda Fitzgibbon. Michael Porter seconded. All voted yes. Mike Klink from Deiss & Halmi Engineering was present to pick-up the signed Sewage Facilities Planning module and Resolution. He left at 8:40 a.m.

Michael Porter motioned to sign the Haborcreek/Mark Corey Bid Agreement, awarded to Suit-Kote Corporation, for 2 miles of Single Asphalt Seal Coat, at a cost of \$1.295 per square yard for a total cost of \$30,389.77. Michael Whitman seconded. All voted yes.

Marlay Shollenberger from Seneca Mineral was present to discuss a quote for 2021 Brine at a cost of \$0.28 delivered. He also stated that they are selling pipe, etc and they are looking into rental of trucks, for brine applications, to be available to Township's in the near future. Michael Porter asked to be sent a Brine Analysis.

Discussion was held on various brine suppliers. Randy Brace also has applied brine for sale, at a cost of \$0.26 delivered. The LeBoeuf Township Supervisors plan to use Randy Brace's Brine for the higher volume roads and Pennfield Energy brine, at \$90.00 per hour, for the lower volume roads.

Michael Porter motioned to hire Wilkinson Excavating to Crush and Screen gravel in the Mystic pit up to \$20,000.00 in total costs. Michael Whitman seconded. All voted yes.

The McGahan Hill Bridge is slated for an inspection. They will be advised that the bridge has been scheduled for replacement this summer, through a grant from the Conservation District.

Road Foreman Report: Drew Francisco reported that 400 tons of millings were acquired from North East Township. All township roads have been graded 1 time each. Tiling and preparation of various roads, for tarring and chipping in 2022, will be accomplished this summer. Ditches may need to be placed on Dutchtown Road for drainage.

Erie Area COG bids were received. The township is eligible to use the prices that were bid out for various items.

The LeBoeuf Township Planners are still working on the Amendments to the Zoning Ordinance. A Zoning Hearing will be held on April 26, 2021 for the Dinsmore Property on Mackey Hill Road. The Dresser Grader has been picked up. Supervisor James Glover signed the Title for transfer to the new owners.

Zoning officer Tim Pietrasewicz reported that a complaint has been registered concerning the "Rainbow Farm" on Old Route 19. There are items located too close to the roadway and they need to clean up their property. A letter will be sent concerning their violations. The Clean-up letter was reviewed and will be mailed out by the end of the month.

Correspondence was read and reviewed.

James Glover motioned to ratify Bills & Payroll for April 8, 2021. Michael Whitman seconded. All voted yes.

Michael Whitman moved, seconded by James Glover, to adjourn the regular meeting at 9:47 a.m. Motion carried unanimously.
