

LeBoeuf Township Supervisors Meeting – May 12, 2021

The LeBoeuf Township Supervisors meeting was held May 12, 2021. The meeting was called to order at 8:00 a.m. Present were James Glover, Michael Porter, Michael Whitman, Tim Pietrasewicz, Drew Francisco and Catherine Wise.

Michael Porter motioned to approve the minutes from the April 22, 2021 Regular Meeting. Michael Whitman seconded. All voted yes.

James Glover moved to submit for audit the Treasurer's Reports for May 6, 2021– General Fund: \$9,726.15 and State Fund: \$113,958.93. Health Reimbursement Fund: \$6,704.13. Line of Credit: Spent: \$19,000.00, Remaining: \$81,000.00. Michael Whitman seconded. Motion carried.

A Resident complained about loud bomb noises in the vicinity of Union LeBoeuf Road on Saturday, May 1, 2021, but he didn't know the exact location.

There were 2 complaints about an obscene sign at Kandy's Dinner Theatre. Supervisors suggested sending a letter asking that the image be changed.

An E-mail was received concerning the Long-Range Transportation Plan and a Survey – A link for the survey will be attached to the Facebook page and Township Website.

Discussion was held on the Amendments to the Zoning Ordinance. Solicitor Chris Sennett and the LeBoeuf Township Board of Planners will be asked to attend the next Supervisor's meeting to answer all questions and to finish the revisions before advertisement for a Public Hearing. PSATS will also be called concerning Solar rules and regulations.

The Advertisements have been submitted for the Mystic Road Bridge Project and the McGahen Hill Road Bridge Project. The Bids will be opened on Monday, May 24, 2021 by Engineer Mark Corey at the Municipal Building and then forwarded to the Supervisors on their May 26, 2021 meeting for approval. More information was received concerning the Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds and the available uses for the monies.

Road Foreman Report: Drew Francisco reported that the road crew has been grading roads and placing cold patch where needed. Limestone was placed on a portion of Woods Road: Mill Village Borough will be billed for half the cost. The Aluminum Bed in the Tri-Axle needs a new floor. An estimate will be acquired. Tabled. Discussion was held on fixing Old Route 19. A leveling course needs added, and the concrete bumps reduced.

Zoning Officer Tim Pietrasewicz reported that the Mill Village Volunteer Fire Company's Fire Police will be asked to direct traffic for the Clean-up Day. Clean up day was discussed, everything is ready.

Correspondence and Permits were read and reviewed.

Michael Whitman motioned to ratify Bills & Payroll for May 6, 2021. Michael Porter seconded. All voted yes.

Michael Whitman moved, seconded by Michael Porter, to adjourn the regular meeting at 9:05 a.m. Motion carried unanimously.
